

# Mobile Food Kitchen Opens At Meadow Gardens

Norwalk Housing Authority is pleased to announce that the Bridgeport Rescue

Mission Mobile Food Kitchen will start serving FREE hot takehome dinners at Meadow Gardens weekly on THURSDAYS from 6:00 PM – 7:00 PM starting on Thursday, March 14<sup>th</sup>.

In partnership with the Norwalk Housing Authority, Bridgeport Rescue Mission Mobile Food Kitchen has been serving FREE hot take-home dinners weekly at 2 other housing sites:

- Washington Village Learning Center on Tuesdays, 6:00 PM 7:00 PM
- Roodner Court Learning Center on Fridays, 6:00 PM 7:00 PM

Approximately 100 meals are served nightly to anyone in need, no ID necessary, and open to all. In addition, the Bridgeport Rescue Mission Mobile Food Kitchen provides take-home lunches weekly on Sundays around noon at Ryan Park off of Day Street. Bridgeport Rescue Mission also provides food for the Bridge Church, located on the lower level of 20 North Main Street Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from noon until 2:00 PM.

Sondra Henry is now the proud owner of a home! Sondra is a 2012 Norwalk Housing Authority Section 8 FSS graduate and recently became a homeowner on February 7<sup>th</sup>. Sondra is a single mother and even though she has a disability, she works

full-time and does not receive supplemental security income. She has been diligently working towards homeownership since 2007, paying off her debt and improving her credit score in order to qualify for a mortgage. She is the first person in her immediate family to become a homeowner.



Amy Huertas, age 24, has been a Norwalk Housing Authority resident since 2007. Amy and her husband William are both employed, and they look forward to providing a better environ-



ment for their children. In addition they are anxious to build equity in their new home instead of continually paying rent.

The retailer projects the promise will result in at least 100,000 veterans being hired over the next five years.

### Here's Why You Should File 2012 Income Tax Even if it's Not Required

Even if your 2012 gross income was low enough that you don't have to file a tax return, it's a money wise idea to file anyway. You may be due a federal income tax refund for 2012 because of state and federal earned income tax credits or refundable child care credit:

- \$\$\$ Federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) worth up to \$5,891
- \$\$\$ Connecticut EITC worth up to \$1,767
- \$\$\$ Federal Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit worth up to \$2,100
- \$\$\$ Federal Child Tax Credit worth up to \$1,000 per child
- You may need proof for Federal College Assistance

Receive your tax refund faster by filing online and have your refund electronically transferred to your bank account. Have your income tax prepared at one of the free tax preparation sites, and you don't have to pay the \$20 to file! Free income tax preparation is available through mid-April at:

- Norwalk Community College, 188 Richards Avenue, Rooms W135 and W138 from 10:00 AM 3:30 PM on Saturdays (walk-ins only), closed 3/30/13
- NEON, 98 South Main Street, 5:00 PM 8:00 PM on Mondays and Wednesdays
- Norwalk Public Library, Belden Avenue from 2:30 PM. to 8:00 PM on Thursdays; and from 9:00 AM 1:30 PM on Saturdays.
- South Norwalk Library from 3:00 PM 8:00 PM on Tuesdays; and from 9:00 AM 1:30 PM on Saturdays.

#### **Employment Tip of the Month Reference List**

Prepare a list of three people to use as references for a job. Make sure you have their full contact information (name, address, company, title, phone, email) and have asked for their permission in advance, and bring copies of your reference list to your job interviews. Good choices of references include previous managers and peers from your former employers, including volunteer activities, or teachers or instructors of education and training programs you have attended. Avoid using personal friends and family as references. It's a good idea to contact your references in advance with specifics about what the job requires, so that the reference can be prepared to best help you with your job search.

### NHA Testifies Before Labor Committee in Hartford to Advocate For Increase in Minimum Wage

Lisa Roger delivered testimony before Connecticut's Labor Committee on January 31<sup>st</sup>, advocating for bill <u>SB 387</u> to increase Connecticut's minimum wage currently at \$8.25 per hour by 75 cents per year for the next two years and then indexed to inflation. In her testimony, Lisa stated, "Many people wrongly assume that only high school kids or drop-outs receive minimum wage at \$8.25 per hour. The fact is that 10% of all workers in Connecticut earn less than \$9.75 per hour, the proposed minimum wage rate for July 2014. Of these, 80% are 20 years and older, and 80% have at least a high school diploma." In total, 42 people presented testimonies both in favor and opposed to raising the minimum wage.

If you are a high school senior and have not contacted Carla Conway, do so now at 203-838 -8471, ext. 176. Also, full-time stu-

dents in college who are not in the NHF Scholarship program should contact Carla.

Don't be fooled by for-profit schools. If you do not want to go to a 4-year college and want a different type of career that is mechanical, technical, health services, office support or *other*, you should look at NCC, or other community colleges which offer a variety of 2-year programs ending with an associate degree including auto mechanics or various medical support areas. Don't be fooled by the for-profit college ads that offer certificates in medical/health fields, auto mechanics, computer technology or office skills. You can find many of the programs they offer at a community college for less money with a degree that will be far more impressive and you won't have to take out big loans.

FEDERAL FAFSA Deadline is by Midnight Central Time June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2013. The Federal Award is up to \$5,550 and is income based.

Housing Authority Insurance Group (HAIG) Scholarship is now available online at the HAIG website (Google it). All public housing and section-8 residents who have over a 2.0 GPA and have lived in NHA subsidized housing for over 1-year may apply. Applicants will submit their own applications but must have a resident verification statement from NHA. Winners are selected through lottery.


# Creative Arts Combine Writing and Art in February Classes.
