REGISTER YOUR VEHICLES

NHA Residents living at the following developments must register their cars in order to park in the on-site parking lots: 20 West Avenue; Chapel Street; Fairfield Avenue; Irving Freese; John Shostak; King Kennedy; Leroy Downs; Ludlow Village; Meadow Gardens; Roodner Court; Seaview/Fort Point; School Street; Senior Court and Washington Village. If you do not register your car, your car may get towed. To register your car, you must bring your driver's license, your vehicle registration and your insurance to the front desk and fill out the vehicle registration form. The cost of having your car towed is \$160.00 and if it is hooked the cost is \$88.00.
