NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Housing Authority of the City of Norwalk (NHA) will hold a public hearing regarding flat rent changes. The public hearing will be held on July 22, 2014 at 6:00 PM at the Leroy Downs Apartments, 26 Monroe St., Norwalk, CT. NHA is amending its flat rent policies to comply with the statutory changes contained within, Public Law 113-76, the Fiscal Year 2014 Appropriation Act. NHA will set the flat rental amount for each public housing unit that complies with the requirement that all flat rents be set at no less than 80 percent of the applicable Fair Market Rent (FMR) adjusted, if necessary, to account for reasonable utilities costs. The new flat rental amount will apply to all new program admissions effective September 1, 2014. For current program participants that pay the flat rental amount, the new flat rental amount will be offered, as well as the income-based rental amount, at the next annual rental option. NHA will place a cap on any increase in a family's rental payment that exceeds 35 percent, and is a result of changes to the flat rental amount as follows: Multiply the existing flat rental payment by 1.35 and compare that to the updated flat rental amount. NHA will present two rent options to the family as follows:

- The lower of the product of the calculation and the updated flat rental amount; and
- The income-based rent

New Way to Get Info at **Social Security Offices**

Beginning August 1, you will not be able to get a "verification printout" of your Social Security number (SSN) at local Social Security offices. If you need proof of your SSN, and you cannot find your card, you will need to ask for a replacement card. To get another card, fill out an application (Form SS-5) which you can get online at www.socialsecurity.gov. You can take or mail your application to any SS office. To find a local office, go to www.socialsecurity.gov/locator. Your card will be mailed to your home in 7-10 days. And, beginning October 1, you will not be able to get a "benefit verification" letter at local SS offices (except in special situations). You can get the benefit letter online with a MySocialSecurityaccount or by calling 1-800-772-1213.

Lease Reminders...

Residents are reminded that it is a lease violation to have a person who is not on the lease live in the apartment, or to use any NHA apartment as an ad-



dress to receive mail. Lease violations can lead to termination. Please be mindful that your lease states, "The composition of the assisted family residing in the unit must be approved by the NHA. The family must promptly notify the NHA in writing of the birth, adoption, or court-awarded custody of a child. The family must request NHA approval to add any other family member as an occupant of the unit".

Opportunity For NHA Resident Owned Businesses

Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 is a law that provides a hiring preference to low-income persons and businesses who are qualified applicants for positions of certain HUD-funded projects, including construction projects. Residents of NHA and low-income residents of Fairfield County qualify as Section 3. HUD's Section 3 Business Registry is a listing of firms that have self-certified that they qualify as a Section 3 Business (51% of the business is owned by Section 3 residents; OR 30% of full-time staff are Section 3 residents; <u>OR</u> your firm provides at least 25% of the total dollar amount of its subcontracts to Section 3 Businesses). If you qualify, self-certification is easy. Register your business at https://portalapps.hud.gov/Sec3BusReg/BRegistry/ BRegistryHome to be included in a searchable online database that can be used by housing authorities including NHA to invite Section 3 businesses to submit Requests for Proposals (RFPs) or bids for HUDfunded projects. Healthy Minds, Healthy Communities


Mental illness is one of the few remaining taboo subjects in our society. Yet one out of five

Is Your Child Currently Enrolled in Preschool?

The Norwalk Housing Authority (NHA) Head Start / School Readiness Program is a State and Federal Funded Program which offers pre-school services to children ages 15 months through 4 years old.

The Program has two different options:

- 6 hrs classrooms (9:00am 3:00pm) No fee involved
- 10 hrs classrooms (7:30am 5:30pm) –Sliding fee scale involved

The goal for the children enrolled at the NHA Head Start/School Readiness Program is to enable them to master social, emotional, cognitive, and physical skills, so that they can be better prepared when entering Kindergarten. The program also offers comprehensive services to the entire family based on the families' needs while encouraging parent participation in their children's education and encouraging them to become advocates for their children. All applications need to be complete prior to submitting in order for your child to be placed on the waitlist, **Incomplete applications will not be accepted.** A parent check off list is attached to the application. NHF College Scholarship Program Receives 53 Full Applications

Norwalk Housing, which runs the most comprehensive scholarship program among Connecticut's public housing authorities, received 53 applications, a record number. "The number shows how important this program is to our residents," said NHA Executive Director, Curtis Law. "Residents know that education is the path to a better, more secure future. In Fairfield County, which is a highly educated area, people need an education to successfully compete for well-paying jobs. Passing the 50 application mark is equally impressive because of the growth of this Program. "In 1998, the program started with 2 scholarships and \$5,000" continued Mr. Law. "Last year 35 residents were in the Program and received \$177,350 plus an extra \$85,500 in leveraged scholarships. We have impressive high graduation rates and our graduates of the program are our best advocates for going to college. We could not have grown and met the needs of residents without the generosity of the people and businesses of Norwalk." Currently, scholarship interviews are being held. The awards will be on July 18th, 6:00 PM at Stepping Stones Museum for Children. Please join us for the awards. U.S. Representative Jim Himes will be the keynote speaker and Mayor Rilling is scheduled to attend along with other elected officials and community leaders.
