Tiahna Spencer a first year medical student at UConn recently advised NHA that her research was published in the journal of Pharmacology Biochemistry and Behavior. The highlights of the article

#### were

- The tremulous jaw movement (TJM) model of tremor was developed in rats
- Galantamine-induced TJMs occur in the parkinsonian tremor frequency range.
- This mouse model offers new approaches for modeling drug induced tremor.

#### Financial Management Tip of the Month: Do NOT risk financial penalties for not having health insurance!



Those who go without health care coverage for a few months

or those who just don't get coverage at all need to know that there may be a **TAX PENALTY** for not getting healthcare coverage. This tax penalty applies to all U.S. citizens and those lawfully present in the U.S. who do not have health care coverage or who have a gap in coverage for three months or longer during the span of a year. There is a monthly penalty for each month you fail to be covered, you may have to pay 1/12 as the annual penalty. The easiest way to avoid the tax penalty is to get covered! #### 20 West Students Visit Metropolitan Museum of Art



In October, select 20 West Learning Center students were given the unique opportunity to participate in the "Turkish Rug Project." This project, lead by Metropolitan

Museum of Art artist-in-residence, Peter Hristoff, introduced students to the history, culture, and art of traditional Turkish rugs. Turkish rugs historically have an array of uses, including room designations, seating, and prayer.

Peter Hristoff taught students about all of these traditions, and shared actual Turkish rugs with them. Once the students were educated, he then invited them to create their own designs to be made into actual rugs in Turkey by local rug weavers. Peter Hristoff, a painter, has had an ongoing relationship with a village in Turkey and the women who hand-craft these rugs. He has opened up venues for many students through different organizations and institutions to participate in this unique collaborative.

To celebrate the completion of the student's rug designs, Peter Hristoff invited the participating students to join him at the Metropolitan Museum of Art on Friday, November 6<sup>th</sup>, to tour several exhibits. Besides visiting the section of the museum where student's explored the beauty of larger-than-life Turkish rugs, they also toured the Mummy exhibit and the Congo exhibit. Each exhibit explored the culture and art of the region, inspiring the students.

- Text-to-self connections are also important; something that I read reminded me of an event or time in my life.
- The text-to-world connection is a very rich connection; something that I am reading is causing me to reflect on current events.
